West Virginia Laws

West Virginia law relating to oil and gas activities exists in two forms – code and regulations. Regulations are based on the requirements of code passed by the state legislature and are created by departments within the executive branch. The Office of Oil and Gas, part of the Department of Environmental Protection, creates regulations that are authorized by the legislature.

Office of Oil and Gas regulations are:

35CSR1 – Miscellaneous Water Pollution Control Rules

35CSR2 – Oil and Gas Operations – Solid Waste Rule

35CSR3 - Coalbed Methane Wells Rule

35CSR4 – Oil and Gas Wells and Other Wells

35CSR5 – Designation of Future Use and Inactive Status for Oil and Gas Rule

35CSR6 - Abandoned Wells Rule

35CSR7 - Certification of Gas Wells

35CSR8 – Rules Governing Horizontal Well Development

[CSR stands for Code of State Rules (or Regulations). CFR stands for Code of Federal Rules (or Regulations).]

Condensate storage tank secondary containment.

35CSR1.7 requires secondary containment for condensate storage tanks. Must be "sufficiently impervious." Must have a rainwater drain.

The Office of Oil and Gas' *Erosion and Sediment Control Field Manual* states the containment must be able to hold 110% of tank's contents.

Federal law, 40CFR112, states that tanks holding 1320 gallons or more of diesel or condensate, on or near navigable waters used for interstate commerce or their tributaries, must have secondary containment and emergency response plan.

API number

35CSR4.5 requires the correct API number on all active or plugged wells. The number includes state (47) – county – and state assigned well numbers.

Pit freeboard

35CSR4 requires at least 2 feet of freeboard on pits holding drill or fracture waste.

Other useful state regulations:

47CSR2 – Requirements Governing Water Quality Standards [includes chronic and acute concentrations for surface water]

47CSR12 - Requirements Governing Groundwater Standards [includes MCLs for groundwater]

47CSR58 – *Groundwater Protection Rule* [includes secondary containment for aboveground tanks and other requirements]

58CSR35 – Rules for Conditions Upon Which Oil and Gas Operators May Access State Forests

60CSR3 – Voluntary Remediation and Redevelopment Rule [includes soil screening levels]
